Responsibilities include:

- The focus of the committee is supporting local and worldwide projects that reflect the values and views of our Streetsville congregation.
- The Outreach committee last year spent approximately \$20,000.00 of your envelope givings.
- 13% of envelope givings are divided between United Church’s Mission & Service fund and Streetsville United’s Outreach committee.
- The committee divides monies equally, to local and worldwide groups, some well known and others not so.

## SEWING KIT

- 1 package of hand sewing needles
- 3 yards or metres of cotton/cotton blend fabric
- 2 spools of thread
- 1 card of buttons
- 1 pair of scissors

Wrap all items inside fabric and secure with string. Place inside a We Care bag, secure with masking tape and mark: "Sewing Kit". Please include a donation of \$5 to cover the cost of shipping.

## LEARNING AND LIVING KIT

- 3 lined notebooks
- 10 unsharpened pencils with erasers
- 1 metric ruler (30 centimetres), 1 pencil sharpener and 1 eraser
- 1 pack of crayons (or pencil crayons)
- 1 small and simple toy (new and not requiring batteries)
- 1 bar of soap and 1 toothbrush (new and wrapped)
- 1 tube of toothpaste (expiration date no earlier than one year)

Arrange all items on the notebooks and place into the We Care bag. Fold over the top of the bag and secure with masking tape. Label by writing "Learning and Living Kit" on the masking tape. Attach the toy to the outside of the kit with string or a rubber band. Please include a donation of \$5 to cover the cost of shipping.

## TEACHER'S KIT

- 1000 sheets lined paper and 1000 sheets blank or coloured paper
- 20 pairs of scissors
- 20 metric rulers (30 cm), 20 erasers, 20 pencil sharpeners
- 10 calculators
- 5 packs of pencils and 5 packs of markers
- 2 geometry sets
- 1 box of paper clips and 1 pack of rubber bands
- 1 deflated soccer ball with sports pump
- 1 stapler with box of staples

Place all the items inside a sturdy box and pack with crumpled newspaper. Secure with packing tape and mark: "Teacher's Kit". Please include a donation of \$10 to cover the cost of shipping.

## QUILTS AND BLANKETS

- Adult quilts should be approximately 1.5 x 2 metres (approximately 60 x 80 inches) and of medium weight and thickness (approximately two kilograms or four pounds).
- Simple and sturdy machine-sewn quilts are best.
- Tie layers together with yarn or floss.
- Smaller children's quilts and blankets are welcome.
- Blankets should be clean and in good condition.
