

## FRESH START



To accompany our new leadership, Council has approved a new program called Fresh Start.

We are planning 5-Sessions this year. Sessions we have planned are as follows: Transition, Dialogue, Entering a New System, Sharing and Understanding our History, and Power, Authority and Influence.

We had open discussions in transitioning our church back to "normal". Council Members and non-council members participated in this session and strong communication channels have been opened to assist a full return to all church activities. This session included a broader number of church members, which is ideal to generate new ideas for our transition and new leadership. A congregational project was suggested, and this will be examined in the coming months.

Dialogue is a much broader topic. The principles were well established and so far, council and committees' meetings have been actively practicing the principles learned in this session.

**Entering a New System** was a challenging session. The session dealt with interpersonal relationships and behavioural models. The group dealt with group dynamics, and we discussed how different we all are and how to work more cooperatively together transitioning to a post-covid environment.

Council has been active initiating some transitional/dialogue issues brought forth from the Fresh Start Program. See separate report on Fresh Start in this issue of Tidings.

### Highlights

- Teresa Judd has joined Council with the Ministry and Personnel Committee
- Council approved the Provisional Call for Reverend Joe Hopkins
- Council diligently monitors our budget position in all revenue and expenditures
- Council approved continued support in Reverend John Ambrose's initiatives with refugees from South America and Ukraine
- Council approved returning to Baptism Ceremonies
- Finance Committee initiated a complete review of rental rates. All rates have been increased for the balance of the year
- Initial discussions were presented for Regional Remit regarding Autonomous Indigenous Church... more to come in the coming months
- UCW organized a Recognition BBQ for our many volunteers who work in many ways to support our church and the community of faith in our area. Total support from Council
- Council has approved an updated policy regarding funerals

Future council issues will include our activities with Pathway, Indwell linkage, continuation of the Fresh Start Program, SUC website upgrade, updating our Community of Faith Profile, and discussion regarding an in-house Community Program, which all members of our church are encouraged to participate.

Church Members are encouraged to bring forth issues or concerns to Council. Members are also encouraged to attend any Council Meeting. (Second Tuesday of the month).

## **Our Financial Situation**

Monthly offerings continue to do better but trending less than the 5-month linear budget. Although this is encouraging, offerings are still below linear budget by (\$2,544) YTD. Rentals are less than the previous year, however, slightly better than budget YTD. The great news, with the garage sale and MacGregors Meats our receipts year to date are just shy by \$503 on YTD linear budget.

Expenses are well controlled with \$4,437 less than budget which improves our YTD deficit situation.

Overall, we have a **deficit** of \$10,637 YTD and when compared to a linear budget of \$14,571, this means we are tracking \$3,934 YTD. The first time better than budget this year! Let us keep the momentum going. Below you will see a chart showing the numbers to date.

With the summer approaching we encourage everyone to remember that church expenses do not take a holiday. We need your regular donations and ongoing support even if you are not in attendance at church.
