The Rabbi of Solel congregation sent the following information to Roman Spector, the General Manager of Pathway. He passed the information about a Jewish Ukrainian refugee family along to Board members and encouraged them to share with members of their congregations. Pathway is trying to get the family one of their subsidized apartments.

Please take the time if you are able, to read through the following.

I have received a request from Rabbi Pollack to assist a family. Is there anything Pathway or any of our congregations can do?

We have been approached by a Jewish Ukrainian refugee family that settled in our area for help. Since arriving in Canada, the husband has been diagnosed with an aggressive cancer and has subsequently lost his job. They have three children, the youngest is 3 years old. The wife is unable to work because she is home caring for the three year old and the husband. They are looking for help finding a daycare spot and a 3 or 4 bedroom rental in the GTA that is well below market value (they can only afford \$1000-1250 in rent and even that is assuming they will be relying on food bank for food). If they can find a daycare spot for the baby, she can try to find work. They are no longer receiving any support from Ukrainian and Jewish services and are in dire straits.

Our congregation is small, and we haven't been able to help with these needs. We started a Go Fund Me page for them and were only able to raise a couple of thousands of dollars for them. I am hoping you can send this email to the rest of our board. They are willing to move anywhere at all in the GTA so he can continue to get treatment and she can find a job.
