MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Christ is risen! Christ is risen, indeed! Alleluia!

This is the traditional Christian Easter affirmation—that the grave could not hold God in Jesus Christ, and God's resurrection power has burst forth to bless all of God's creatures.

And isn't it nice that the Easter celebration here in northern latitudes coincides with the beginning of spring? Soon itty-bitty bunnies will be born, and new eggs will appear in nests. There are signs of renewal all over the place during spring, and while we don't *have* to connect them with Jesus' resurrection, we followers of Jesus can praise God for Easter blessings with every bunny and egg that we see!

I also see signs of renewal in our Streetsville United Church community. New people are stepping into leadership roles. Different folks are offering new ideas to reach out to our neighbours. I can even see our Fresh Start sessions bearing fruit (if you know where and how to look). With this renewal of energy, we will spend the Easter season (because Easter is a *season*, not merely a single Sunday) focusing our worship on "signs of renewal," beginning with signs in the sky with a full solar eclipse on April 8. Are you ready for all this renewal?

I also challenge you to engage in our vision renewal project. I have heard many folks say that they feel that our Streetsville UC community feels rather directionless right now. Perhaps you have wondered why your bright, young minister hasn't taken the reins more and set a course yet. I strongly believe that the Holy Spirit has a direction for us, and we need to open our hearts and minds to discern what that Spirit-given vision is for us. And we need to discern that Spirit-given vision together. Soon our vision sub-committee will distribute a questionnaire for each member and adherent to complete to help us clarify our church values. Please complete this survey reverently, perhaps even with "fear and trembling" (Phil. 2:12), as we invite the Spirit to guide our discernment.

God's resurrection power did not merely raise a singular man from the dead two millennia ago. The resurrection is ongoing! As the songwriter Jeremy Camp declares, "The same power that rose Jesus from the grave...lives in us!" May you experience resurrection and renewal in this Easter season!

UPCOMING SERVICES AND EVENTS!



Local women sew reusable menstrual supplies, make soap and underwear. The rest of the world joins in to make purses to hold these supplies using a pattern provided by Sew Powerful. UCW members Katie Powell, Sharon Smale, Bev Mathew, Sheila Wilson, Emily Hodges, Jean Stopa and Wendy Johnson made 30 purses. We are grateful to the UCW executive for paying for the postage to mail the purses and for the \$10 US per purse that is asked for to help with the sewing in Zambia. The number of purses made last year worldwide was over 29,000. We were proud to be a part of this ministry.

Finance Report

The February financial numbers are comparable to those of 2023. The month ended with a deficit of (\$6,600). The YTD deficit is (\$10,900) compared to (\$10,700) last year. There are many sources of seasonal revenue to come – Easter givings, camp rentals, fundraising events, new opportunities etc. Property projects have yet to be determined, however we know there will be expenses this year where last year was minimal.
