The work of Council continues to monitor finances, Governance and Constitutional updates. Council continues to engage with our membership to develop a new Mission (or Purpose) for Streetsville United. All of these "key" initiatives will be moved forward as we operate through the balance of this year.

As part of revitalizing our communications, Randa Tadros will be working on everyone's behalf to improve our web site, which we plan to complete by the end of the year. Members are asked to forward any thoughts to Randa that will assist in our web site redesign and communications.

## FRESH START

We have now completed 8 modules of the Fresh Start program, a program designed to help both new ministers and their congregations in a time of change. After 2 long term ministers of 20 years each, followed by a very brief term, and now a young and dynamic minister, the change that is happening at SUC can result in many different emotions. The Fresh Start program has helped those in attendance to deal with the change, share concerns, ask questions and move forward.



The modules covered include: Transition, understanding the difference between change and transition; Dialogue, searching for common ground; Entering a New System; History, Sharing and Understanding, understanding how the history of a community influences the Community of Faith and the wider church; Planning for Effective Ministry, the importance of discerning, planning, doing and reflecting; Decision making, types of decision making and who should be making them; Renegotiating Roles and Expectations, the importance of communication in giving and receiving feedback; and Finances, how spending should reflect the church's vision, mission, and values.

The plan is to complete the program this fall with 2 more sessions. All are welcome to attend and participate in these valuable discussions.

## ROOF REPAIR



Roof 95% Complete

Once again, the Finance Committee must share the unfortunate news of a needed repair to our beloved heritage building. You may be aware that there was a water leak into the church office. You may have noticed the scaffolding and work being done on the office wing. The roof of the office wing needs to be replaced. The good news is that this roof has lasted 29 years – much longer than normal roof life expectancy.

After receiving quotes for the repair, the Property committee selected Cherry and Hoyle, the company we have hired for previous repairs. The cost is \$24,500 + HST. Fortunately, we have money available in the Bequest Fund that will provide 75% of this amount = \$18,375. The other 25% must come from the congregation = \$6,125.

The other good news is that due to your kind and generous donations to the Masonry Repair Campaign just a few months ago, the excess amount raised of \$4,900 will be applied to this roof repair. The balance of \$1,225 is the amount we need to raise.

The units are now into summer social activities and events, going outdoors for meetings and planning potlucks and BBQs before going different ways for the summer. We appreciate the contributions of all our members as they share their time, talents and treasures with others and our church community doing God's work in many ways!

## Property News

SUC has had two major building related projects since April.

The heritage building masonry has been repaired, including work on the church spires that required urgent attention, shown in the before and after photos shown right.



During spring rains, the roof over the office area began to leak, and has had to be replaced (the roofing in that area was almost 30 years old). New roofing has been installed, and the project will be completed shortly, with the replacement of some flashing.

We are fortunate that we have been able to pay for most (75%) of these costs from bequest funds. But we are also fortunate that we have been able to raise the other 25% required from the congregation through fundraising campaigns. Thanks to all who have supported these efforts, and to members of the Property Team who have coordinated this important work.

The focus is on a specific job for a shorter timeframe and once completed, the members' responsibilities are finished. This endeavour was very successful in the responses and many people have volunteered to assist on various committees within the church and beyond.

Activities taking place:

1) **Chase the Chill** is returning. Knitted scarfs are to be tied to lamp posts in the early morning on a given day in the winter. Karen Monk is taking the lead on coordinating the tasks required for this.

2) A number of people have signed up to assist **assembling the furniture for the Cornerstone Suites**, the new Indwell building next to the church, once construction is completed. Diane Wilton is taking the lead on coordinating this project.

In May, Reverend Joe had a Bike Blessing and Community Wellness event that took place at the front of the church, with some activities in the parking lot. People from Streetsville United and within the community attended and took part. Thanks to



Sandy Jutzen, there were vendors and local organizations that participated on the day. Thanks to Jennifer Honsa and her family members for assisting with bike repairs. Also, thanks to Cathy Hitchcock for assisting with the organization and being available on the day of the event.

In May, a conference of Ontario BIAs was held in Streetsville. Sandy Jutzen organized a tour of our church for the participants. It was led by Kay Mathew, her final walking tour and the first time that she included our church. Sandy, Cathy Hitchcock and Reverend Joe were there after our Sunday service to welcome the participants and assist with the presentation.

One of the responsibilities that continues is dispersing 13.5% of envelope givings to various organizations. This money is split 50/50 between Streetsville United Church Outreach and UCC M&S fund. The committee will be meeting within the next month to make decisions as to where the money will go.

# Finance Report

The May financial numbers are significantly better by \$4,715 than the previous year's YTD and \$7,023 better than our 5-month linear budget. This good news, although positive, will unfortunately not continue. The month ended with a deficit of (\$9,785) making our YTD result a deficit of (\$5,385) compared to a deficit of (\$10,100) last year. Expenses are well controlled and remain under budget for five months by almost a \$1,000.

The second quarter revenue numbers included the following one-time receipts:

- Garage Sale contribution of \$6.2K – in 2023 garage sale was in May (timing)
- Annual UCW Donation of \$5K – in 2023 UCW donation was later in the year (timing)
- Annual donation to SUC through the UCC Foundation
- Special Easter Offering of \$3.1K

As we head into the summer months, donations tend to drop off and expenses continue. Please support SUC as you are able if you are not in attendance at church.

**Reminder if you have not reviewed your PAR or automated giving's in over a year to kindly review and if you are able to increase it, please reach out to Bev Mathew.** There has been a significant drop in PAR giving's the past few months and it is important that we do everything we can to continue the increase in envelope offerings.

Donations to UCC Foundation which will be sent to SUC can be beneficial to both the donor and SUC. If you are interested in finding out more information, please reach out to anyone on the Finance Committee and/or your financial advisor.
